



Multisystemic Therapy (MST)

MST is an intensive family and community-based treatment service that addresses multiple aspects of serious anti-social behavior in adolescents. The multisystemic approach views an individual's behavior as being influenced by the systems around them—family, peers, school, neighborhood—as well as by the individual's thoughts and feelings about those systems. MST interventions address the many factors that are known to contribute to delinquency where the youth lives, works and plays.

- **Proven clinical home-based intervention that promotes behavior change in the youth's natural environment**

- **Treatment is approximately four months**

- **Targets chronic, violent, or substance-abusing juvenile offenders at high risk of out-of-home placement**

- **Estimated savings is from \$31,000 to \$131,000 for each youth served compared to out-of-home placement***

- **25 to 70 percent decrease in adolescent substance use, adolescent psychiatric symptoms, and long-term rearrest rates**

- **47 to 67 percent reduction in long-term, out-of-home placement**
